Tournament Rules Off Limits: 12:01 am October 31, 2022, to ooze off November 5, 2022. Boaters Meeting: Saturday, November 5, 2022, 6:00 am. Air Force Marina, CJ Strike. Tournament hours: Safe Light (approx. 7:00-7:15 am.) to weigh-in at 3:30pm.

Limit: Five (5) fish minimum length 12”.

No sharing of fish between team boats!!

1. Sportsmanship: Any contestant who displays poor sportsmanship, violates these rules, or is ticketed for violations of state fish and game laws will be disqualified. Good sportsmanship and fair play should be directed at non-tournament anglers on the lake during the period of the tournament as well as other tournament participants.
2. Safety: Safe boating conduct and all safety precautions must be observed. Everyone fishing the tournament must have a life vest and other safety equipment as specified by the Coast Guard. Life vests must be worn and the kill switch attached to the driver when the big motor is running.
3. Tackle: Only artificial lures may be used. No prepared or live bait, other than pork type strips or rinds, is permitted. Only rods and reels are permitted. A live well or suitable substitute is required.
4. Permitted Fishing Waters: No touch rule will apply in fishing waters. No fishing within the no wake zone in front of ramp coves. 35 mph speed limit and no passing in the Narrows.
5. Check-in: All boats must check in at official checkpoint which will be announced at the boaters meeting.
6. Penalties: Contestants who have not checked in at the official check point on time will be penalized 1 pound of weight for every 1 minute of tardiness. A boat checking in 10 minutes late, will be disqualified. Boat and/or motor trouble are not exceptions. Any bag weighing in a fish smaller than 12 inches will be disqualified. Fish will be measured mouth closed. Fanning of the tail is permitted. Fish will be measured on a FLAT Board. Fish must be alive to qualify as Big Fish, dead fish penalty is .25 lbs. Dead fish will not be weighed for big fish. A bag with more than a 5 fish limit will be disqualified.
7. Scoring: Scoring will be determined by the team total weight consisting of no more than 5 bags of 5 fish in each bag for a 25 fish total. A .25 lbs. penalty will be assessed for each dead fish weighed in. In case of a tie, largest single bag weight among teams will determine the winner. In case of a tie for largest fish, the highest team weight determines the winner.
8. Off Limits: Any contestant determined to have fished during off-limit dates/hours, will result in boat disqualification.
9. Complaints: Complaints must be submitted to the designated tournament director in writing no later than 30 minutes of weigh-in. Decisions of the tournament officials are final.
10. Alcohol: Alcohol consumption is not allowed during tournament hours. Individual violators will be disqualified.
11. Motor Bands: Motor bands are required and will be provided at boater meeting.
